

This will be a very busy weekend for many parents as they pack up the kids and send them off to college. As someone who worked on a college campus for many years, I know it's an exciting time for the students, especially for freshmen, most of whom are living on their own for the very first time. There are so many things competing for their attention, so many things happening, so much to discover, that the one thing that so often is forgotten is God.
