Summer vacations are over, kids go back to school and it seems like the summer is over. But before that can happen, we need to have one last holiday. We have Labor Day.

The fist Labor Day was celebrated in 1882 and it became a federal holiday in 1894 following a large and violent strike by a major union. As first proposed, Labor Day was to a day of street parades to exhibit to the public "the strength and esprit de corps of the trade and labor organizations," followed by a festival for the workers and their families. Today it is viewed as a last hurrah marking the end of summer; a chance for one last celebration before we get back to the reality of work and school.

As Christians, Labor Day should remind us that work really is a gift from God. Work is how we contribute to the common good. Work is how we continue God's plan of creation. Work is how we find our fulfillment as creatures created in the image of a God who choose to create.

# <u>Choir Recruitment Weekend:</u> <u>Sept. 10-11</u>

Two years ago, I wrote an article in the bulletin asking every parishioner to briefly reflect on his or her role in the St. Mary's Music Ministry. I explained how every single person in the church is a part of the Music Ministry, whether or not they are a member of one of the organized ensembles that sings or plays at the masses. As a refresher, consider the Vatican II document Sacrosanctum Concilium (Constitution on the *Sacred Liturgy*), in which we are instructed to maintain "...full and active participation (in the liturgy)..." in order to express our "...true Christian spirit." I hope you have been able to grow in your prayer life by singing more at mass (or starting to sing!), even if it is what some would consider "minimal." This is not an audition or an arena to evaluate whether or not some of us are "good enough" to be audibly singing. We all have the same end goal in our singing and worship. I hope you continue to push yourselves to do your part in filling the church with glorious song!

That all being said, it is now the time of year when we as the Music Ministry reach out to you and ask for an increased level of commitment to the church, if you are willing. We are always looking for you (and your family, friends, etc.) to lend your talents to one of our choirs (Adult, Filipino, Folk Group, Children's, or Bell Choir) and help lead the rest of the congregation in song. Information and sign-up sheets can be found near the choir platform. Don't be shy! Come talk to myself or one of the ensemble members after any of the weekend masses, even if you are not fully sure if you would like to make a commitment. As I tell everyone who apologizes for sometimes not being able to commit to a group, "Come by any time. We are always here!"
