From the Pastor

Each week, when we gather for mass, our profession of faith declares our belief in the "Communion of Saints." What is this "communion" we profess to believe in? What is the Church saying when it declares a certain individual to be a saint? What is the purpose of All Saints Day and what is the connection with All Souls Day? In the coming week, we will celebrate these two important days on the Church calendar, so it might be wise to reflect on what it is we are called to celebrate.

When the Church declares a certain individual to be a saint, what the Church is saying is that not only did that person live a holy life worth emulating, but that we believe that person is in heaven. That is why we are encouraged to pray that the saints will intercede on our behalf. Who better to ask for prayers than those who stand before the throne of God?

Over the centuries, thousands of men and women have been declared to be saints. But that does not mean however that they are the only ones in heaven. We live in the hope that all those who have lived and died as faithful followers of Jesus will receive the reward of eternity with our God. All Saints Day is for all the countless men and women whose names are known to God alone. They have received the gift of paradise and from their place in heaven they intercede for us with our merciful Father.

I am sure we all know someone we are positive went straight to heaven but there are those may not have been ready to stand face to face with our God at the time of their death. For those, our faith teaches us that they continue their journey to God in Purgatory. Just as we ask those in heaven to pray for us, we pray for those in purgatory. All Souls Day is an opportunity to remember all those we love, those we pray for and those who pray for us.

In God's love, we are in Communion with all the Saints in heaven. We are also united with all the souls in Purgatory for we share with them the hope that we too may join the Communion of Saints that stand before the throne of our loving God.

Nov. 2 - All Souls Remembrance

Within the Catholic community, the month of November is a special time when we remember those who have gone before us in faith and now share in the peace of the Lord's Kingdom. There are several ways in which we will remember them again this year:

1. parishioners can write the names of deceased loved ones in our Book of Life;
2. parishioners can bring in a photo of a deceased family member/or friend and place it in our remembrance area near the statue of St. Joseph; ***(Please be sure that your name and telephone number are on the back of the photo so that we can call you when it is time to pick them up.)***
3. come to our 7:30PM Mass that day;
4. if you have buried a loved one from St. Mary's this past year, come to the 7:30PM Mass that day when they will be named in the General Intercessions.

Our belief in the Communion of Saints reminds us that, as we read in our funeral services, "...the ties that bind us to one another do not unravel with death."
