Dear Lord,


O Divine Giver of all gifts, grant us the daily graces we need to follow closely in the footsteps of Jesus in the way we live out our lives and make use of our gifts.



The policies of the Archdiocese require, that once a year, pastors make a report to the parishioners on the financial health of the parish. As you can see from this year's report, St. Mary's experienced a large decrease in revenue during the past fiscal year. This decrease is almost exclusively due to our loss of the tenant in our school building and the assessments associated with this rental income. All other revenues and expenses are, for the most part, where they should be.

While we have not found a new tenant for the entire school, we hope to rent out a portion of the building in the near future. This should enable us to finish the current fiscal year without any significant deficit. The only reason this is possible is because of the generous support we receive from our parishioners and for that, I am truly grateful.
