His official feast day is not until next Friday, but this weekend, we will celebrate St. Patrick, the patron saint of Ireland. While it is true that, in this country, the celebration of St. Patrick's Day has become more than the celebration of a 5th century bishop and has instead become a celebration of all things Irish, it is important to remember who St. Patrick was and how he worked to establish the Catholic faith in Ireland.

Details about Patrick life are extremely limited but from the two writings he left, we know that he was born in Britain and at the age of 16 was captured by Irish raiders who took him to Ireland where he lived in captivity for 6 years. As Patrick states in his "Confession," it was during this captivity that he experienced a spiritual awaken that led him, after his escape, to return to Ireland as missionary.

Early medieval tradition credits St. Patrick with being the first bishop of Armagh and Primate of Ireland and while evidence indicates that he was not the first missionary to bring Christianity to Ireland he certainly worked tirelessly to spread the Gospel and is honored for his efforts to convert all Ireland.

Our parish's celebration of St. Patrick is made special this year as we bless our new statue of St. Patrick. This statue was made possible by special donations from our parishioners and we are extremely grateful. In a parish with such a strong Irish heritage, it seems only appropriate that a statue of St. Patrick be present to watch over our Church.


TIGER FOR A DAY
