From the Pastor

Last month, our parish kicked off this year's Archdiocesan Annual Appeal, "Sharing God's Blessing." For those of you who got to watch the video, you know that this appeal is an important part of the Archdiocese annual budget funding many important ministries including Catholic education, seminary education, and Catholic charities.

Each parish is assigned a goal for participation in this appeal which is based on regular collection income. Because our parish is still working towards our goal for the Living Stones Capital Campaign which began last year, St. Mary's Appeal goal was reduced from \$57,000 to \$30,600. In the past month, we have received several pledges for the Annual Appeal but we are still a long way from reaching our goal. Once our goal is reached, half of what is collected will be returned to St. Mary's.

I understand that many parishioners have chosen not to participate in this year's Annual Appeal because they are still working on fulfilling their pledges to the Capital Campaign. Because we have already reached our initial goal for the Capital Campaign, half of what is collected is coming back to our parish.

Some parishioners have chosen to make a pledge or a donation directly to St. Mary's recently established "Elevator Fund." All funds returned to St. Mary's from either the Capital Campaign or the Annual Appeal will go directly into this Elevator Fund. The cost for an elevator that will serve both the upper and lower churches is approximately \$300,000. I am sure that you agree that a church elevator is essential to the future of St. Mary's and with your help, I am certain that it will soon be a reality.
