

From the Pastor

On Saturday, May 13th, Pope Francis marked the 100th Anniversary of the miracle of Fatima by canonizing two of the three shepherd children who were blessed to have experienced the apparitions of Our Blessed Mother. It is appropriate that this would occur in the month of May since May has long been considered the month of Mary.

The tradition of dedicating the month of May to Mary started in the 13th century. It became especially popular with Jesuit students and by the year 1700 had spread to the whole world. During this month we offer to Mary our fervent and loving devotion and as Pope Francis have stated, "We ask Mary, our Mother, to help us pray with a humble heart." Mary is always for us the perfect model of discipleship.

During this special month, it is tradition that a statue of Mary be crowned with flowers. We invite everyone, especially the youngsters who have recently received First Holy Communion, to join us at the conclusion of the 12 noon Mass as we crown the statue of Mary in the prayer garden.

As Mary instructed the children of Fatima, we are all called to pray the Rosary for world peace. Our devotion to Our Blessed Mother, especially in the month of May, reminds us that we are called to be faithful followers of her Beloved Son and that we are sent into the world to reflect his love.
