
In Loving Memory

Transfiguration Academy

Middle States Reaccreditation & Tiger for a Day

The Middle States Association of Elementary Schools recently completed their reaccreditation visit of our Academy. This process involves the entire school community examining where the school is now and planning for the continued improvement of the school over the next seven years. Although the written report will not be available for several months, at the conclusion of the three day visit, the team was very affirming of Transfiguration Academy.
