From Dr. William Mascitello

As I write this column, I am privileged to be attending a conference sponsored by ISREV, the International Seminar on Religious *Education and Values*. The conference is being held in Nuremberg, Germany (the site of the Nuremberg trials after World War II). As a member of this group, I will present an academic paper about Religious Education in the United States. There are people here from all over the world, but only a few from the United States. It is amazing how seriously people from different parts of our world take Religious Education. The mayor and some council members of the city held a reception for us in the city hall. Both public and private schools in most countries have Religious Education classes of some sort. You may know that years ago in the United States there were four "R's" in school – Reading, 'Riting, 'Rithmetic, and Religion. Perhaps this is something we need to reconsider ...

In the meanwhile, although we are on a break from school, let's think about how to support our local Religious Education efforts that will begin soon here at St. Mary's. And let's pray that our efforts may help our children and all of us to recognize that when we turn to Jesus, the Bread of Life, we will never hunger or thirst.
