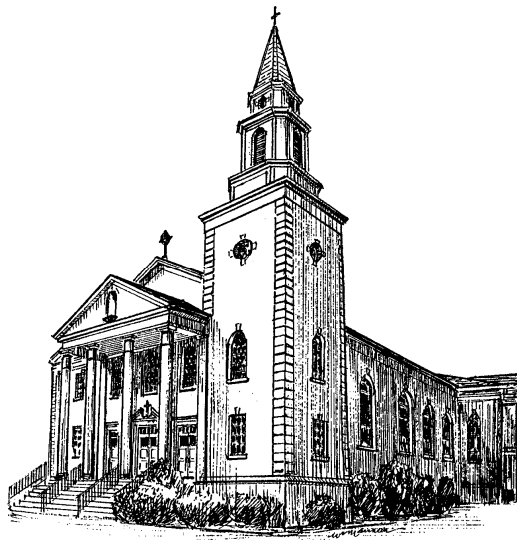

## ***PD's Reflections***

When I was growing up my parents carefully planned vacation trips. In June we would head to the Jersey shore for several days and during August our destinations included West Jersey, New York and Vermont. We have fond memories of these trips and many years we try and plan reunions although the fact that the family has spread from coast to coast makes that a challenge. However, the value of time to recreate often empowers us to recreate so that we return to work or school with new perspectives.

I have continued these traditions most years but there was a change of plans as I spent most of August and early September in Englewood. In fact as I type these reflections it is exactly a year since I began my chemo and radiation. Thankfully the results of those treatments were very successful and I look back and realize the important lessons I learned. I am most grateful for all the prayers, cards and gifts I received. Fr. Carey and Fr. Barone were very supportive telling me not to worry about responsibilities here but focus on getting well.

I continue to appreciate the healing environment I encountered at Englewood Hospital from the doctors and nurses to the friendly people who park cars to the volunteers who gave me a glass of water and a warm blanket to the receptionists who maintained a welcoming, positive approach every day to the technicians who made me feel I was the only person they treated that day. To them I am most grateful.

Not only did I miss the chance to experience a normal vacation, but my team did the same. I never went to a treatment, a test or a consultation with a doctor or nurse alone. My sisters Terry, Maureen and Alicia and my friend Patti changed some of their plans to journey with me through the summer of '17 and I'm a deeply appreciative.

A sign of progress is that I am planning more conventional vacation plans this year. However, I am aware that there are many others who face what I faced a year ago. Let us continue to pray for them and when able we can support them in their journey.

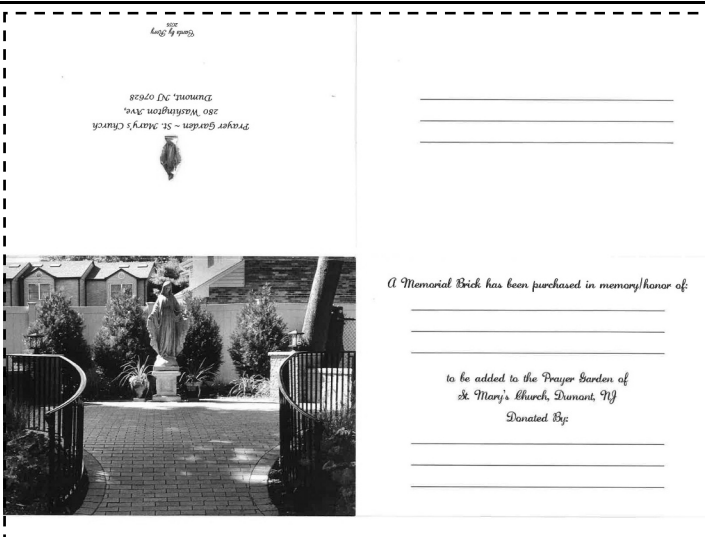

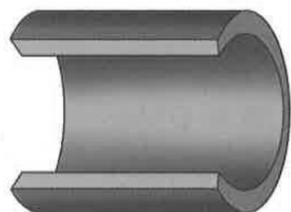

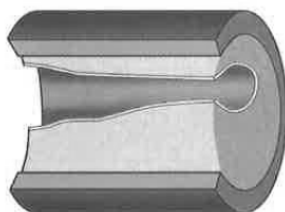
