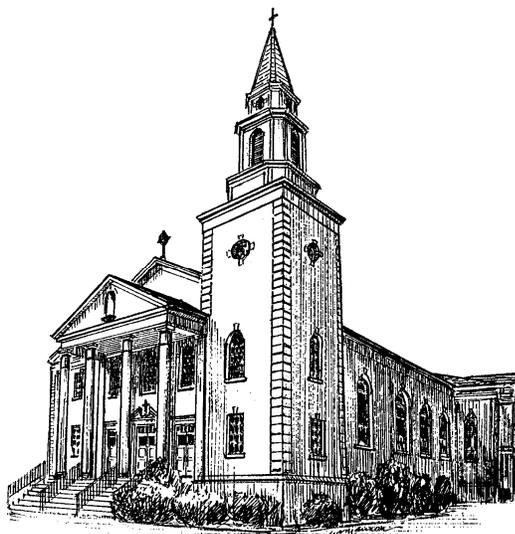

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. From the Pastor

Geographically, the Archdiocese of Newark is one of the smallest dioceses in the country. However, based on population, we are one of the ten largest and one of the most dioceses in the United States. There are almost 700 active and retired priests currently serving in the Archdiocese of Newark.

In the two and half years that Joseph Cardinal Tobin has been our Archbishop, he has worked to get to know our diocese and to know us priests. He has done so during very difficult times for the Archdiocese of Newark and for the Church Universal. In order to better know the priests of the Archdiocese and to address some of our many concerns, Cardinal Tobin has called for a Convocation of all the priests of Newark. This Convocation will begin this coming Monday, June 17th and will conclude on Thursday, June 20th. The hope for this Convocation is uniting the priests of the Archdiocese of Newark in our mission to proclaim the Good News of Salvation under the leadership of our Archbishop.

During the three and half days of the Convocation, Fr. Pat and I will be out of the parish. We have arranged for a priest who is a member of a religious community to say the 7:00 am mass for the three mornings we will not be here. In place of the 8:45 am mass, our Director of Religious Education, Dr. Bill Mascitello, will lead a Communion Prayer Service. We will not be that far away and we will be able to respond for any emergency situation.

I ask that you pray for all the priests of the Archdiocese during this time of Convocation. Pray that it may be a time for fraternity and time of renewal in our commitment to serve the people of this great Archdiocese.
