

Wouldn't it be a wonderful thing if all of us heeded this message all of the time? I believe that most people are basically good, and basically honest, and want to do the right thing.

However, I also believe that you would have a hard time finding a single person who, at some point in their lives, have not yielded to the temptation to tell a lie - large or small, and thereby pushed a problem into the future to be dealt with again and again.

Telling the truth is such a "magic potion". It may be difficult, embarrassing, or painful. It may mean setting aside pride or seeking forgiveness. It may even mean admitting weakness, or finding a humility we never knew we had.

When people do not lie, others feel secure around them. When people do not lie, they like themselves better and they begin to radiate an aura of confidence and positive energy. When people do not lie, truth flourishes and EVERYONE benefits!


