The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## **Ministry to the Sick and Homebound**

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

On Friday, November 1st, we will have Eucharistic Adoration after the 8:45 a.m. Mass in the Upper Church. Since November 1st is **All Saints Day** and it's a **Holy Day of Obligation** and we have a Mass at 7:30pm, the **Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament ends at 6:00pm**. Please make a note of this change.

*In observance of All Saints Day, the Parish Office will be closed on that day.*

From the Pastor



All Saints' Day, officially known as the Feast of All Saints, is celebrated every year on November 1st by the Roman Catholic Church and also by some Protestant denominations. Eastern Orthodox churches celebrate the Feast of All Saints on the first Sunday after Pentecost.

The earliest observance of the holiday was recorded in the early fourth-century but it did not become an official celebration of the Church until the early seventh century under Pope Boniface IV when he consecrated Rome's Parthenon to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs on May 13 in 609 AD. Pope Gregory III officially made All Saints' a holy day in the mid-eighth century and moved it to November 1. The Feast of All Saints' celebrates all those who have entered heaven, including those recognized as saints by the Catholic Church and, more importantly, those whose names are known to God alone.

All Saints Day is closely linked to All Souls day which follows on November 2nd. All Souls Day is a day on which we remember all those who have died. But in a special way, we remember those who were not fully prepared to enter into joys of heaven at the time of their death. Like you and me, they continue their journey of faith as they are perfected by God's grace and mercy. We assist these beloved dead on their journey with our prayers.

In God's love we are in communion with all the saints in heaven. Through God's love, we pray for all those who continue their journey of faith after death; those souls, who like us, hope to one day join the Communion of Saints who worship before the throne of God.

On Saturday, Nov. 2, the Church remembers the souls of all those who have gone before us, marked with the sign of faith.

- We are inviting the families of those who have been buried from St. Mary's this past year to the 8:30 A.M. Mass that Saturday. At that liturgy, their loved ones will be mentioned by name in the General Intercessions.
We invite all of parishioners to bring in a photo of a loved one who has passed away. As in previous years, we will place their photos in a special place of remembrance near the statue of St. Joseph where they will remain for the entire month of November as will the envelopes from our parishioners containing the names of their loved ones. (Please make sure that you write your own name and telephone number on the back of the photo so that we know to whom it belongs.)
In addition, all the members of our community are invited to write the names of family members or friends who have gone before us in the Book of Life.

Our belief in the Communion of Saints reminds us that, as we read in our funeral services, "...the ties that bind us to one another do not unravel with death."

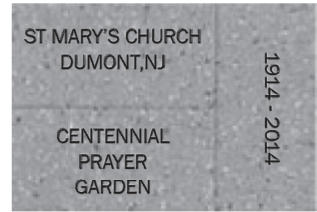
