

Catechumenate

As we continue to adjust to the restrictions put in place to help reduce the spread of the corona virus, none have been harder to deal with than those surrounding the death of a loved one. Hopefully, the Archdiocese will soon provide new directives for wakes and funeral masses. On Monday, the Office of Catholic Cemeteries did provide new directives for cemetery services.

These new directives are as follows:

On Mother's Day, Sunday, May 10, all archdiocesan cemeteries will be open for visitation from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and will be open for visitation every Sunday, thereafter.

Beginning on Monday, May 11, up to 10 family members will be permitted to attend a burial service. (Currently, two family members only are permitted.)

Until further notice, all committal services are limited to immediate family only and not to exceed the recommendations of New Jersey Executive Order No. 107 (2020) and Administrative Order 2020-04, that gatherings of 10 persons or fewer are permitted.

Beginning on Monday, May 18, cemetery visitation will be permitted weekdays, Monday through Saturday, from 3:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m., after all interments are completed.

Memorial Day Masses at our all archdiocesan cemeteries are postponed until further notice. Announcements are forthcoming regarding a live-stream or video of Memorial Day Mass at Holy Cross Cemetery.

These are rules for cemeteries operated by the Office of Catholic Cemeteries of the Archdiocese of Newark. Cemeteries not operated by the Archdiocese may have different rules.
