Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

God's Plan for Giving - Tithing

Tithing is God's plan to support His Church. Full tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your parish Church. The other 5% goes to your favorite charities.

From the Pastor

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity; one of the most fundamental mysteries of our faith. We believe in only one God yet we profess our faith that this one God exists as a trinity of persons united in a community of love. As individuals created by the Father, redeemed by the Son and empowered by the Spirit, each of us is invited to be part of this community. Each of us is called to be united with our God and with each other.

We are called to be united but sadly, each day we are confronted by numerous stories and news reports about how divided we are as a nation and as a world. The stress created by the uncertainty of covid crisis has caused many to feel lonely and isolated and afraid. Millions are unemployed and the future is uncertain which only serves to exacerbate the situation. The tension, the stress and the uncertainty has led many to turn to protest and, sadly, some have turned to violence.
