

Sacrament of Baptism

Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

God's Plan for Giving - Tithing

Tithing is God's plan to support His Church. Full tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your parish Church. The other 5% goes to your favorite charities.

Phase One - Church Re-Opening

Our church will be open daily, Monday through Sunday, from 12:00PM - 2:00PM. You can enter from the door next to the lift, which is near the rectory.

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- ◆ The church is open for personal prayer only.
- ◆ Devotions or other group prayer are not permitted at this time.
- ◆ Please use hand sanitizer upon entering, wear a face mask and keep socially distant.
- ◆ If you are sick, we ask that you do not enter the church and continue to pray from home.

Confessions

As we struggle to get back to some sense of normalcy, the staff of St. Mary's has found a way to provide the Sacrament of Reconciliation that protects both the priest and the penitent with appropriate social distancing.

Please note that our procedure will provide confession face-to-face and will be by appointment only. You do NOT have to provide your name to come for confession.

Each day we hear of new steps being taken back towards normalcy. We hear how major cities are “phasing” in new rules and restriction that will allow more freedom yet maintain safety. Like so many major cities, the Archdioceses of Newark also has a plan with phases to reopen our churches.

The first phase, taken a few weeks ago, has allowed us to open the Church each day for private prayer. The next phase will allow for daily mass with a limited number of people in attendance. Hopefully this phase will occur in the near future. The most significant aspect of this step will be to allow the faithful to once again receive the Eucharist.

Our belief in the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist is fundamental to our identity as Catholics. Today, as we celebrate that great feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ we recall a very special meal that Jesus shared with his Apostles. And we remember He told us, “Do this is Remembrance of Me.”

For almost three months, we have been unable to do so. We have been unable to share in the Eucharist. We have been unable to be nourished with the Body and Blood of our Savior. Let us all pray that the next phase of reopening our churches will come soon and we will all be able to come to the table and meet our Savior in the most holy Sacrament of the Altar
