

Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!

Catechumenate

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

Ministry to the Sick and Homebound

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

God's Plan for Giving - Tithing

Masses:

Sunday Masses:

In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org. You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- ◆ Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- ◆ All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- ◆ All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- ◆ Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- ◆ If you are sick or have been in contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

Confessions:

Please note that our procedure will provide confession face-to-face and will be by appointment only, Saturday between 4:00pm and 4:45pm. Please call the parish office .

Last weekend, 22 men were ordained to the permanent diaconate. On June 30th, three priests were ordained as auxiliary bishops of our Archdiocese. On June 27th, 5 men were ordained as transitional deacons. God willing, they will be ordained priests next year. And on June 21st, 10 men were ordained priests for the Archdiocese of Newark.

Under ordinary circumstances, these ordination ceremonies would be great liturgies before a full cathedral. But these are not ordinary circumstances. Because of restrictions designed to limit the spread of the Covid-19, attendance at these ceremonies was extremely limited and any celebrations had to be seriously curtailed.

Beginning a new role in ministry is always difficult. In the midst of the current pandemic, it must be extremely difficult for these newly ordained deacons, priests and bishops. Let us all pray for these men as they seek to serve Christ and his Church.
