

## **Sacrament of Baptism**

Parents should register for the Baptism Preparation Program at the rectory...even before the baby is born!

## **Catechumenate**

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults is the process by which adults (and children who have reached the age of reason) are prepared to receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. If you, or someone you know, would like to inquire about becoming a Catholic, please call the parish office.

## **Ministry to the Sick and Homebound**

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available to be celebrated with anyone in need. Please do not wait until death is imminent to contact the parish regarding an ill family member. Eucharistic Ministers and others serve our community by visiting and bringing Communion to the sick and homebound. Please call the parish office if you wish such a visit.

## **God's Plan for Giving - Tithing**

Tithing is God's plan to support His Church. Full tithing means 10% of gross income to God. We ask half of this, or 5%, for your parish Church. The other 5% goes to your favorite charities.



## **Updates**

### **Masses:**

#### **Sunday Masses:**

***In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00noon on Friday or by emailing us at [contactus@stmarysdumont.org](mailto:contactus@stmarysdumont.org).***

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

#### **Daily Masses:**

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

### **Guidelines:**

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- ◆ Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- ◆ All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- ◆ All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.
- ◆ All visitors must maintain a 6-foot social distance from others at all times. Please sit only in designated pews. Members of the same household (living together) should sit together in designated areas. No one may sit in the marked off center of the pew.
- ◆ Please do not leave anything behind in the church such as tissues, papers, gloves, etc.
- ◆ If you are sick or have been in contact with someone who is sick, please do not visit the church at this time and wait the required 14 days.

## From the Pastor

Throughout the Church calendar, there are numerous holydays. Some are memorials, more important ones are feasts and the most important ones are solemnities. And some solemnities are so important that Church has declared them to be Holydays of Obligation on which, like Sunday, the faithful are 'obliged' to attend mass. When I was a young student at St. Stephen's Grammar School in Kearny, NJ, we were taught why these solemnities were so important and we were required to memorize them. Placed in order in which they occur in the liturgical calendar they are:

December 8<sup>th</sup>, the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary,

December 25<sup>th</sup>, the Nativity of the Lord (Christmas),

January 1<sup>st</sup>, Mary, the Holy Mother of God

Thursday of the sixth week of Easter, the Ascension of the Lord

August 15<sup>th</sup>, the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

November 1<sup>st</sup>, All Saints Day

I always thought that this was true for the Catholic Church throughout the world. It was not until I entered the Seminary that I learned that it all depends on where you are and what the local bishops and local bishops' conferences decide.

In many parts of the world, there are a number of others solemnities that are also holydays of obligation. For example, in many parts of the world, January 6<sup>th</sup>, the Feast of the Epiphany, is a Holyday of Obligation. Here in the US, we simply move the celebration of the feast to the following Sunday. In most parts of our country, the Feast of the Ascension is not celebrated on Ascension Thursday. It is celebrated on the 7<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter. This year because of the corona virus pandemic, our Archbishop decided that here in the Archdiocese of Newark we also would do so. Additionally, a number of years ago, the US Bishops' Conference decided that if certain holydays fell on a Monday or a Saturday, the obligation to attend mass was "abrogated." The Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is one of these holydays.

This means that next Saturday, August 15<sup>th</sup>, when we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary it will be a holyday but there is no obligation to attend mass. More importantly, Cardinal Tobin's general dispensation from the obligation to attend mass during this pandemic continues.

Given all this, I hope that those who can do so will join us for mass for this great feast. Here at St. Mary's, we consider the Assumption of the Mary to be a patronal feast. More importantly, this feast is all about hope. We celebrate that Mary, the only human conceived without the stain of original sin, was assumed body and soul into the glory of heaven. Where Mary has gone, we all hope to follow.

In these difficult days of the covid crisis, we need all the hope we can get. Hope that our Blessed Mother will intercede on our behalf as she mediates the love of her Son. The only way will get through this pandemic is trust and hope; trust in Our Father's love and hope in a Mother's pray.
