In order to attend Sunday Mass, you must make a reservation by calling the parish office at 201-384-0557 by 12:00n00n on Friday or by emailing us at contactus@stmarysdumont.org.

You will receive confirmation of your reserved spot. Masses are at 5:30pm on Saturday, 7:45am, 10:00am, and 12:00pm on Sunday. We continue to live stream the 10:00am Mass on Sunday for those who are at home.

Daily Masses:

Our daily masses are at 7:00am and 8:45am Monday to Friday and 8:30am on Saturday. You don't need to make a reservation to attend our daily masses.

Guidelines:

Please follow the following guidelines while visiting the church to ensure the safety of everyone at this time.

- Enter the church by way of the propped open side doors.
- All visitors must wear a mask at all times.
- All visitors must use hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church.

From the Pastor

During his pontificate which began in 2013, Pope Francis has canonized 898 men and women. In declaring these 898 individuals to be saints, the Churches teach that not only did these people lives exemplary lives but that we now believe that they have joined the Communion of Saints; the countless multitude that worships God forever in heaven. Next Saturday, Father Michael McGivney, the founder of the Knights of Columbus, will be beatified, the last step before sainthood.

But the communion of Saints is not just those who have been formally canonized by the Church. We live in the hope that all those who have lived and died as faithful followers of Jesus will receive the reward of eternity with our God. All Saints Day is for the countless men and women whose names are known to God alone. They have received the gift of paradise and from their place in heaven they intercede on our behalf before the throne of grace.

I am sure we have all known someone we are positive went straight to heaven but there are those may not have been ready to stand face to face with our God at the time of their death. For those, our faith teaches that they continue their journey to God in Purgatory. Just as we ask those in heaven to pray for us, we pray for all those in purgatory. All Saints Day and All Souls Day is an opportunity to remember all those we love; those we pray for and those who pray for us.

In God's love, we are in Communion with all the Saints in heaven. We are also united with all the souls in Purgatory for we share with them the hope that we too may join the Communion of Saints that stand before the throne of our loving God.

Liturgy Notes:

All Saints / All Souls

The Crisp autumn chill penetrating our bodies reminds us of our weakness before the power of nature. As leaves fall from the trees, plants die and animals retreat, we feel the impending threat of death that waits to take us home.

November has traditionally been recognized as the month in which we as a Catholic community remember and pray for our faithful departed. On the feast of all Saints on November 1, we commemorate all the blessed who enjoy the face of God in their death. On Monday, November 2, we turn our thoughts to the other souls who await the fullness of God's glory. The sequence of these two feasts implies a belief that those who have lived lives of holiness enjoy God's presence and can intercede for us before the throne of God.

When the Church gathers for prayer on November 2, we remember the faithful departed. At the 7:30 p.m Mass on November 2, we will read the names of all who have been buried from our parish this past year. Those who assisted us in life receive assistance from us in their death. This feast celebrates our union with the church in every place and beyond all time.

Here at St. Mary's, we will once again have a special display near the Baptismal font. There will be a listing of those members of our community who died this past year in the special Book of the Dead. Members of our parish community are invited to place a picture of their deceased loved ones in the shrine area set up by St. Joseph. This year due to Covid-19, we will not invite the community inscribe names in the book of the Dead. However, we invite everyone to email the names of their deceased loved ones that would have inscribed in the book and we will print it out and place it in the book.
