
The Paschal Triduum April 1-3, 2021 Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper

We will gather at 8:00 pm in the church to celebrate the Easter Vigil during which our Elect: Ashley Munoz will be fully initiated.





In remembrance of me, heal the sick. In remembrance of me, feed the poor. In remembrance of me, open the door and let your brother in, let him in.


Take, eat and be comforted.

Drink and remember, too.


That this is my body and precious blood Shed for you, shed for you.






