The recent decision by the US Supreme Court has radically altered our focus as we observe Respect Life Sunday. For so many years, the debate on abortion was considered a federal issue. Now state legislators across the country are writing new laws or resurrecting old laws resulting in a hodgepodge of confusing and often contradicting laws restriction on abortion access. Far from settling the debate on abortion, the Supreme Court ruling has moved the abortion debate front and center where extreme voices from either end of the political spectrum are competing to be heard. The Supreme Court decision to overturn Roe v Wade has turned abortion access into a major political issue as our nation approached the mid-term elections.

While the question of abortion must always be our priority when we observe Respect Life Sunday, this day reminds us of our duty to respect and protect all human life; not only the unborn child in the womb but also the elderly, the sick, persons with disability and those marginalized by society. We must also realize the serious threat to human life and dignity caused by racism, the environmental crisis, inadequate health care, poverty and the death penalty.

Pope John Paul II's encyclical 'The Gospel of Life' calls us to build a culture of life and a civilization of love where all human life is protected and nurtured. As followers of Christ, we are all called to the important work of transforming our culture by allowing the Gospel of Christ to touch and transform our hearts and to guide the decisions we make. May our Lord grant each of us the grace to live courageously and faithfully his Gospel of Life.

Sacrament Preparation Programs at St. Mary's

Children of our parish who attend our PACT/ Religious Education Program or a Catholic school come together for separate preparation to receive sacraments of First Holy Communion Penance (Reconciliation/ (Eucharist) First Confession) and Confirmation. Letters are being sent to parents regarding upcoming information meetings. Children do not automatically approach the sacraments if they are in a certain age or grade, but are prepared for sacraments as they develop a relationship with the Lord in his community, our Church.

On Care for Our Common Home

(This is the eleventh in a series of articles on Laudato Si')

Lines of Approach and Action

In this chapter of Laudato Si' Pope Francis outlines five major paths of dialogue to stem the climate crisis.

The first dialogue the pope espouses is a "dialogue on the environment in the international community." The interdependence of humanity obliges us to think of "one world with a common plan." We need a global consensus to fix the problem. The Holy Father advises that "fossil fuels must be phased out as soon as possible," and rejects the buying and selling of "carbon credits." We need to develop "more efficiently organized international institutions" to address global warming and poverty."

The second dialogue necessary is one on a national and local level. "Activity on the local level could be directed to modifying consumption, developing an economy of waste disposal and recycling, protecting certain species and planning a diversified agriculture and the rotation of crops."

Third, the Pope talks about the need for everyone to have a say. "We need greater transparency to access the environmental impact of business ventures and projects. Environmental impact assessment should be included in the planning stages. A consensus should always be reached between the different stakeholders, who can offer a variety of approaches, solutions, and alternatives. The local population, though, should have a special place at the table."

Fourth, the Pope states "Politics must not be subject to the economy, nor should the economy be subject to the dictates of an efficiency-driven paradigm of technocracy." Politics and economy should serve human life." Pope Francis quotes the *Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church*, issued in 2004 by Saint John Paul II: Environmental protection cannot be assured solely on the basis of financial calculations of costs and benefits. The environment is one of those good that cannot be adequately safeguarded or promoted by market forces."

The Pope makes a plea to developed countries that "the time has come to accept decreased growth in some parts of the world, in order to provide resources for other places to experience healthy growth. Benedict XVI has said that 'technologically advanced societies must be prepared to encourage more sober lifestyles, while reducing their energy consumption and improving its efficiency."

Fifth, the Pope speaks about the role of religion. Empirical science can't explain the whole of reality. We need also to look at the ethical and spiritual resources produced by the world's religions.

The majority of people living on our planet profess to be believers, and they need to dialogue with each other and with science on these issues.
