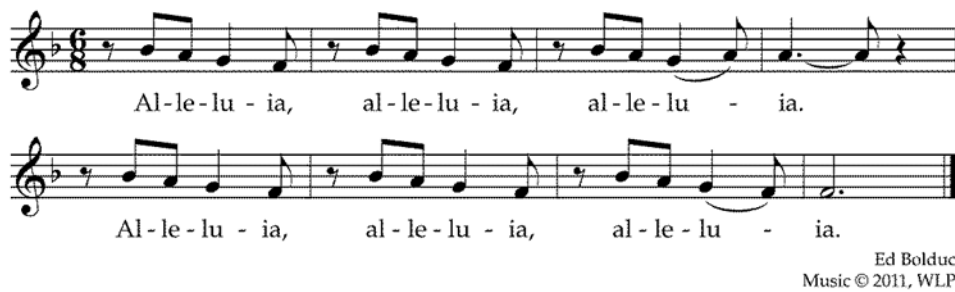
**Reading 2**






