they shall know that a prophet has been among them.

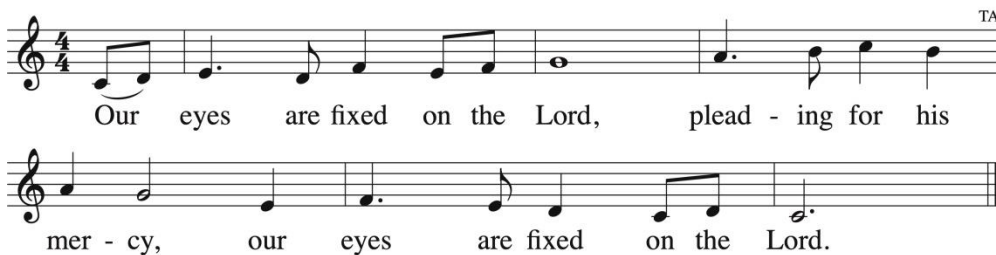
